

JUNIOR POSTSECONDARY PLANNING TIMELINE

Winter

- Meet with your school counselor to discuss your post-secondary goals
 - Continue to explore Naviance & research post-secondary opportunities
 - Research and apply for summer college programs, internships, and/or employment positions
 - Register for college admissions tests (SAT/ACT)
 - Think about the rigor of your senior year schedule & review the Program of Studies
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- Build a resume
 - Register for college admissions tests. Take AP exams and SAT Subject Tests, if applicable
 - Visit colleges & universities. Many students visit colleges & universities over the Spring Recess
 - Sign up for Mock Admissions Interviews
 - Ask for letters of recommendation from two core academic teachers
 - Register on the NCAA website if you would like to participate in Division I or II athletics (<https://web3.ncaa.org/ecwr3/>)

Summer

- Continue to visit college campuses and network with admissions counselors, potential employers, and recruiters
- Finish the first draft of your college essay and your resume
- Create a Common Application (www.commonapp.org) and/or Coalition Application account (www.coalitionforcollegeaccess.org)
- Begin your college applications
- Register for college admissions test (SAT/ACT)
